





Medical Facilities

Fee Concessions and Scholarships

Half fee is waived for 10% of the female students in the College, which includes priority for orphan and haiz e Quran students. Only tuition fee is exempted. Deserving students are assisted by the Red Cross.

Various government scholarships are awarded through the district council. . Fees are waived for two female students who assist in library work.

The fees of the students who take Rehmatul Alamin scholarship will be waived, except for the registraion fee, board , and, the rest of the library security fee. BS-4 year students have to pay the fee every semester Uniform is compulsory for BS 4-year departments.

Note: Applications for fee waivers must be on the prescribed forms. All financial aid is awarded on merit and good character.

Associations and Societies

College Idenity Card.
