With the personal interests and efforts of Sardar Usman Khan Buzdar this institution was provided with daycare center from which the children of the area are benefitted. Inauguration of BS 4 year programs is also the results of unsung efforts of Sardar Usman Khan Buzdar, which has started in the academic year 2019.
